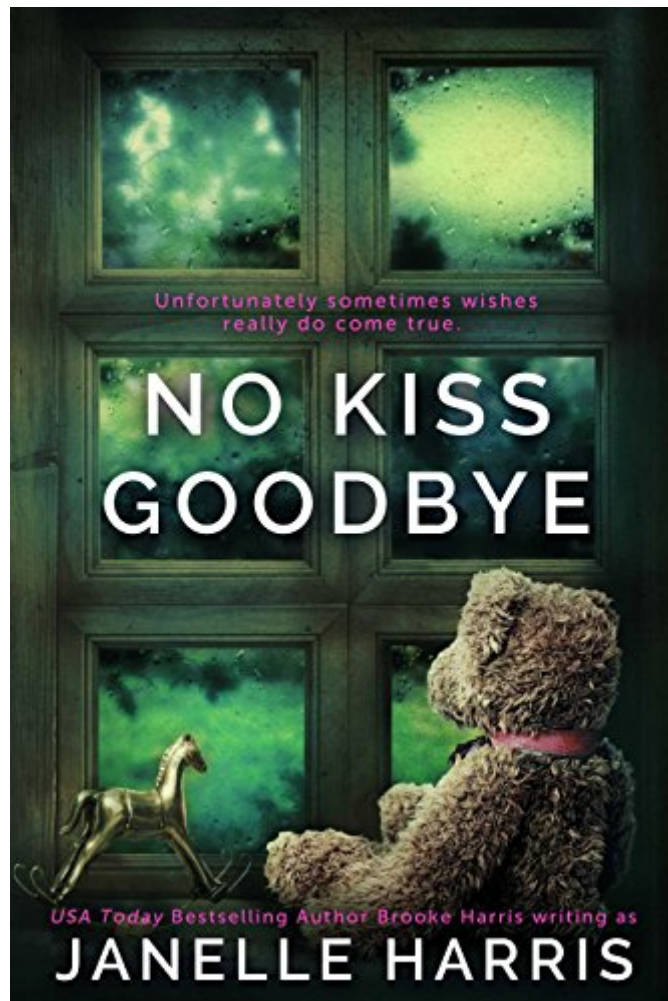

I finished this book a few days ago, but I couldn't get it out of my head. I was even going to bed two

nights later still thinking about Laura. So, I read it again. Twice within a week. I never read a book a book twice, but this book deserved more attention. The mind blowing thing about this plot is it reads completely differently second time around, because I knew the end (which I never would have guessed). The main thing that changes is the dialogue. The conversations read totally differently once you know a big twist. That is brilliant writing. This book is deep, twisted and so, so sad. It is written brilliantly. It sucks you in, introduces you to the characters and develops them beautifully and just as you become friends, just as you think you know these people, have them figured out EVERYTHING CHANGES and you realise the author is so, so clever. My heart broke reading this book. I cried and I cried. Let me try to explain without spoiling any of the plot. Laura is a mother. sometimes over whelmed by life, sometimes pining for the past and carefree days. So in a nutshell she's real and similar to anyone who has kids. Ava is her best friend and they've been friends since childhood. They know each other inside out and their relationship is very entertaining. Mark is Laura's husband, and honestly I couldn't figure out for a long time whether he was good or bad and in the end I was so satisfied with how it played out, even if my heart broke. The story starts in Dublin, takes us to New York and winds back to Dublin again. It explores how very powerful the mind can be and when you don't know who to trust just how dark and twisted the depths of the mind can become. Chillingly psychological and undoubtedly brilliant. To give the book credit, and in attempt to be fair, I thought the book started off well, but it soon plummeted to the absolute depths of drivel. It was almost as though someone else took over writing it as it became so scattered and ridiculous. The writing was corny and clunky, I could not identify with any of the characters and the storyline became so crazy that I actually gave up, after persevering for almost half of it. Who cares what happens in the end? I cannot, for the life of me, understand how this book rated so highly?

I was sent an ARC of this book to read in exchange for an honest review. Right from the beginning of the story I was completely hooked, it's an intense psychological thriller about a wife and mother who has been involved in a car accident and is suffering memory loss. She keeps remembering snippets every now and again but can't piece everything together to remember exactly what happened on that fateful day. The story is full of twists and turns throughout and it messed with my head so much it left me confused at times about what was real and what wasn't. When the truth is finally revealed it hit me so hard that I had to sit there for a few minutes to digest it and take it all in,

it was a total WTF JUST HAPPENED moment! Janelle Harris has totally captured the tragedy that can befall a parent when something like this happens and has taken it to a whole new level. It's certainly going to take a while to get over this one, thank you to Janelle Harris and TBC for this fabulous story.

Only halfway through this book. Am going to finish it because it's driving me crazy that i can't figure out what's going on! While the plot may end up being amazing, I'm not sure I'll survive the terrible writing. I seriously think that this book skipped the basic editing process. The tense changes within a sentence! Run-on sentences read like gibberish. Spelling and grammatical errors appear constantly, and even the punctuation is often incorrect. I'd say it often reads like a middle school-level book, but I've never seen any YA book so riddled with errors and junk. I really REALLY want to know what the heck happened to poor Laura and her mystery kids, so i will read on. But the editor of this book should be fired.

It took a few days to read, as I had very little available time for reading, until this morning, when I read the entire second half in one sitting, as I couldn't put this down.
