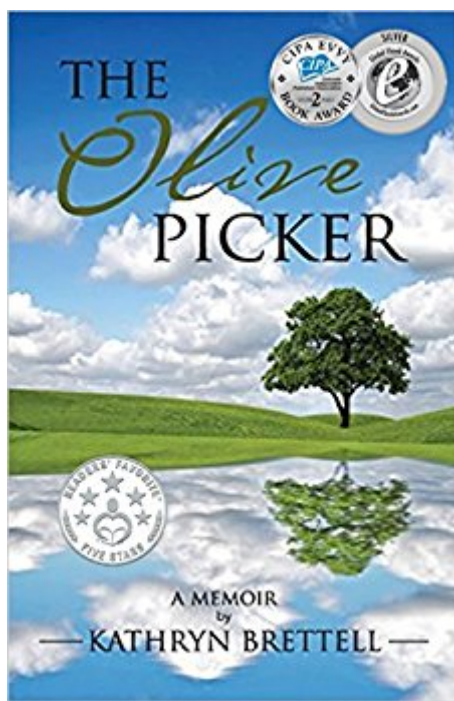


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The Olive Picker: A Memoir

None of us like to dwell on the negative, but it is important to realize that the people around us may have a very different experience than we have, as one in four women experience domestic violence in our country. I hope Kathi's story gives other women the courage to find their way out of an abusive situation.
